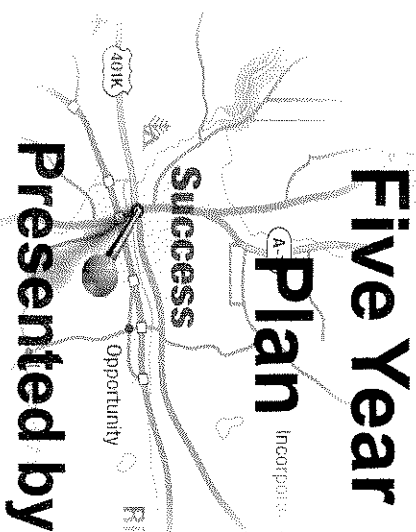

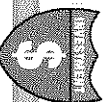

Because of the highly developed concurrent program taught by DHS instructors and the availability of night-time adjunct instructors for our local college campus, we can offer such a program to the youth of Douglas.

High school instructors have been willing to meet the requirements of EWC, which requires a master's degree or previous approval. Douglas is extremely fortunate to have a caring high school staff who are willing to teach the EWC course syllabus and to use college textbooks so that the students have the same academic experience as on-campus college students. Douglas is the only Wyoming high school that offers this variety and number of classes because of the teachers' and administration's cooperation.

The associate's degree in Interdisciplinary Studies focuses on the general education requirements necessary at any institution and allows for half of the degree to be electives.

ADVANTAGES

- * Students can remain at home, eliminating cost of board, room and transportation on a college campus, saving parents approximately \$20,000 for two years at an average university.
- * High school concurrent and college adjuncts who care about each student's success and are willing to work one-on-one with the students.
- * Student/teacher ratio is lower than other campuses.
- * High self-esteem is developed because of accomplishments before transferring to 4-year program.
- * Students transfer to 4-year programs with a proven GPA, allowing more scholarship opportunities.
- * Advising is focused on 4-year degree and a particular institution's requirements.

TUITION COSTS

- * Students pay only 1/2 of the tuition costs due to a .5 mill levy.
