



Veterinary Technology



The Eastern Wyoming College Veterinary Technology Department offers students the opportunity to gain the knowledge and skills necessary to be a successful licensed Veterinary Technician. Four veterinarians and a veterinary technician serve as instructors in this fully accredited program. Facilities include laboratory areas where students will work with companion, food, exotic and laboratory animals. The program provides training in a broad range of areas including laboratory procedures, anesthesia, surgical assisting, radiography and nursing procedures. Graduates may

find employment in veterinary clinics, veterinary diagnostic or research laboratories, veterinary supply sales, veterinary teaching hospitals, humane societies, dairy or stud farms, biomedical research, zoo or wildlife facilities, pharmaceutical or feed sales, USDA/APHIS, or food inspection.

Students who complete the program will receive an Associate of Applied Science Degree in Veterinary Technology. Graduates are eligible to take the Veterinary Technician National Examination, which is required to work as a veterinary technician in many states. Over 90% of the EWC graduates who have taken the VTNE have passed the exam! These graduates are employed as veterinary technicians in Wyoming, Montana, Nebraska, North Dakota, South Dakota, Colorado, Nevada, and Idaho as well as other states where they have sought employment. Veterinary technicians

may specialize in emergency/critical care, anesthesia, veterinary dentistry, animal behavior, internal medicine or equine medicine, or may transfer to pursue a Bachelor's Degree in Veterinary Technology.
